

Bible Books - Chapter by Chapter Series Galatians

Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

The Galatians were allowing themselves to be entangled in their old ways and Paul has something to say to them about that. Galatians was written to several churches instead of one. Galatia is a region, not a city. It is an area of what is today Turkey. It was a word sort of like our word America in that it could mean more than one area. Sometimes we say America when we mean the United States of America. Sometimes we say America when we mean the whole continent of North America. Paul may have meant the geographical region of



Galatia or the Roman province of Galatia, which overlapped considerably but were not exactly the same thing. Both included several different early Christian congregations.

Suggested methodology for each lesson:

- 1. Fellowship (Save most of this for the end of class.)
- 2. Take prayer requests (Try to keep it from becoming a competition to see who has the most or the worst.)
- 3. Pray (The idea here is to leave our troubles with God so we can give His word our attention with a clear mind.)
- 4. Read the lesson's chapter aloud from the Bible. (... or a few verses at a time as you answer the questions.)
- 5. Answer and *briefly* discuss the "fill in the blank" questions. (Let those who prefer to listen, listen. My answers on the next page are just one opinion; you may have a better answer.)
- 6. On the final "Think & Pray" question everyone should take a few minutes to pray over it and jot down their own thoughts before the discussion. This will give the Holy Spirit a time to speak.
- 7. Discuss your "Think & Pray" answers. (Never force anyone to share theirs. As with the other questions, my answer is just one more opinion; you may have a better answer.)
- 8. Close in prayer (It is best to call on others to pray, but try to get their permission ahead of time.)
- 9. Fellowship (Leave this as open ended as possible for the time and place you meet.)

Depending on the number of people, each lesson is expected to take about one hour. Steps 4 thru 7 are about half of that. If you take longer, let each lesson take more than one meeting, or consider breaking into two groups. If you take less time, extra questions are provided for discussion called "For Further Thought"

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Galatians Introduction Paul was writing because the Galatians were picking up some of their old habits. They may have started to require gentiles to undergo Jewish rituals like circumcision, they may have adopted some of their old idol worship ways, or they were doing something else like that. The letter is not clear. Both of the first two things are mentioned but they could have been just examples of a wider problem or an analogy of what was actually going on.

Galatians, Chapter 1. Paul, after a short greeting, expresses surprise at the behavior of the Galatians. Then he defends his apostleship, perhaps because some were doubting his authority. Answer these questions while reading chapter 1:

Galatians Chapter 1

[1K] GALATIANS 1:11-24 Raised by atheists, I used to love to argue with Christians to see if I could plant any seeds of doubt. Yes, seeds were planted, but in me. When I came to the end of myself I was ready to commit suicide. I went to my backyard in the middle of the night to plan how to kill me. Instead the Holy Spirit reminded me of all those debates with Christians that I thought I had won, but had really lost. I figured I had nothing to lose. I was done with my life anyway, so I gave it to Him. That was over 40 years ago. God has never forgotten me or forsaken me, although I have betrayed Him more than once. I have numerous stories of miracles and answered prayers. If you are going to testify you need to have some stories as well. If you can't explain how Jesus Christ has made a difference to you personally, than Christianity will just sound like one more religion among many to your listeners.

For further thought:

- (1L) In Galatians 1:6-9 Paul speaks about those preaching a distorted or perverted Gospel. Certainly we have our fair share of cults in our day. Without naming an organization or using a label what distortions of the gospel preached today disturb you the most?
- (1m) In Galatians 1:11-13 make it clear that Paul is the one who led his readers to Jesus Christ. Who led you to Jesus Christ and how did they do it? What are you doing to help others to hear and accept the Gospel of Jesus Christ?
- (1n) In Galatians 1:10 Paul appears to be responding to an accusation that he was just trying to please people. What evidence would you have to refute such an accusation if it were made against you?
- (10) When you compare the introduction of this letter to Paul's other letters do you see a difference? Why? Could it be that Paul was bit upset with these folks?
- (1p) Compare Galatians 1:13-1:24 with Acts 9:1-31 and Philippians 3:4-6. Does Galatians add anything to our understanding of the conversion of Saul, the persecutor, to Paul, the preacher?
- (1q) Paul preached for many years before he got formal approval from the church in Jerusalem. What implications does that have for the organized institutional church of today?

Galatians Chapter 2 The defense of Paul's apostleship is ended by pointing out that the other apostles acknowledged him, and that Peter himself was an equal to Paul since Peter accepted Paul's correction. The theme of the letter is introduced - becoming right before God by faith. To be justified is to be declared innocent by a judge or other authority. Answer these questions while reading chapter 2: [2A] How long was it between Paul's first and second visit to Jerusalem?
2B] Who was with Paul on his second visit to Jerusalem?
2C] Did the apostles require Titus to be circumcised?
2D] The false brethren were spying on what?
2E] What does God not show?

[2L] GALATIANS 2:19-20 Christ died on the cross for us. We are buried with Him and rose again with Him in Baptism. (See Rom 6:4 and Col 2:12) Dead people are no longer under the control of the law. (See Romans 7:1-25) The police do not go to cemeteries and arrest people. Our new life is Christ's life. He bought and paid for it. We should do our best to please Him, but out of love and a sense of gratitude, not out of fear of punishment.

- (2n) Compare Galatians 2 with Acts 15:1-34. Are they talking about the same events? Why or why not?

- (2q) In Galatians 2:10 everyone agrees to remember the poor. How does that relate to the points being made around it?

- (2s) Compare Acts 13:38-39 with Galatians 2:15-16. What is the same and what is different?

Galatians Chapter 3 Faith is superior to Law. We are all heirs of God's promises through our faith. Answer these questions while reading chapter 3:



Galatians Chapter 3

- [3A] How many questions does Paul ask in the first five verses?
- 5 to 7 depending on the version you are using. At least one per verse. Gal 3:1-5
- [3B] Who are the true sons, children or descendants of Abraham?
- Those of the faith or those that belong to Christ. Gal 3:7 and 3:29 It means Christians
- [3C] Which came first, the promises to Abraham, or the Law to Moses? The promises to Abraham.

Gal 3:16-18

[3F-M] GALATIANS AND THE OLD TESTAMENT

[3M] In each pair of verses Paul is quoting the Old Testament. Clearly Paul regards the Old Testament to be the authoritative word of God, and applicable to his readers. God does not change.

[3N] GALATIANS 3:24 My view is that by coming to realize through the law that we do not live up to any reasonable standard of righteousness ,we become aware of our need for Salvation in Jesus Christ.

(30) What "bewitches" you if you are not careful? (Gal 3:1)

(3p) When you are making an important decision how do you distinguish the voice of the Spirit from you own thoughts? (Gal 3:2-5)

(3q) Gal 3:5 talks about the miracles among them. Do you experience miracles? If so, give an example. If not, why not?

(3r) In Gal 3:15-18 Paul makes an issue of the difference between "seed" and "seeds." Why?

(3s) In Gal 3:1-5 Paul asks the Galatians several questions. If those questions were directed to you, how would you answer them?


(3t) In Gal 3:25 Paul says that because of our faith, we are no longer under the law. How then are our actions governed and our lusts mitigated?



[5K] GALATIANS 5:24 Paul answers my question in the next verse - by walking by the Spirit instead of in sin. He has already covered this ground in Galatians 2:19-20 - "For through the Law I died to the Law, so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me." Paul gives a fuller explanation of the same concept in Rom 6:5-14.

For further thought:

(5L) If we are Christians why do we still struggle with the "deeds of the flesh" listed in Gal 5:19-21?

- (5m) If you are like me some of the things on the "deeds of the flesh" are not even a temptation for me, while others I struggle to avoid, not always successfully. How is it for you?
- (5n) Are you bearing fruit for the Kingdom of God? Beside each fruit mark the column "how much" as "a lot", "some", "a little" or "none" depending on how much of that fruit you see in your own life. In the notes column put a very short explanation. We are all stronger in some areas than others.



Faith is the necessary first step, and all that is necessary, but if it does not bear fruit in terms of a growing obedience to His will, how can we argue that we really believe Him?

(6k) In Gal 6:1 Paul talks about restoring someone caught in a sin? How does that work exatly?

(Hint: Matthew 18:15-18)

(6L) In Gal 6:2 it mentions the "law of Christ." What is it talking about?

- (6m) Many people think Paul was blind or close to blind. Two pieces of evidence for this are found in Galatians Gal 4:15 & Gal 6:11. Whatt do you think about this theory?
- (6n) Is there a verse or passage in Galatians that you think would be good to memorize? Why?
- (60) If someone asked you what Galatians was about, what would you tell them?
- (6p) What do you hope you will always remember from your study of Galatians?
