# **FIRST PETER**

Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is living and effective and sharper than any double-edged sword, penetrating as far as the separation of soul and spirit, joints and marrow. It is able to judge the ideas and thoughts of the heart."

### **Course Text: First Peter**

The book of First Peter is about maintaining holiness in the face of sufferings whether from persecution, neglectful authority, or satanic trickery. It talks about the completeness of Christ's redeeming work on our behalf and the glory that will be ours in the end. I think the biggest lesson for me from this book is the idea that our circumstances never excuse our behavior. We are to always act like Christians, no matter what. I know that this is impossible, so I just hope and pray God will give me the grace to at least act like a Christian when it is most important that I do so.

This little book was written by Simon Peter the apostle of Jesus Christ. This is the one who walked on the water to Jesus and denied Jesus Christ three times and wept. This is the one who was miraculously freed from prison by an angel and who performed many miracles in the name of Jesus Christ.

### Suggested methodology for each lesson:

- 1. Fellowship (Save most of this for the end of class)
- 2. Take prayer requests (Try to keep it from becoming a competition to see who has the most or the worst)
- 3. Pray (The idea is to leave our troubles with God so we can give Him our full attention.)
- 4. Read the lesson's chapter aloud from the Bible (or a few verses at a time as you answer the questions.)
- 5. Answer and *briefly* discuss the "fill in the blank" questions. (Let those who prefer to listen, listen. My answers on the next page are just one opinion; you may have a better answer if it is Scripture based.)
- 6. On the final "Think & Pray" question everyone should take a few minutes to pray over it and jot down their own thoughts before the discussion. This will give the Holy Spirit a time to speak.
- 7. Discuss your Think & Pray answers. (Never force anyone to share theirs. As with the other questions, my answer is just one more opinion; you may have a better answer.)
- 8. Close in prayer (It is good to call on others to pray, but try to get their permission first.)
- 9. Fellowship (Leave this as open ended as possible for the time and place you meet.)

Depending on the number of people, each lesson is expected to take about one hour. Steps 4 thru 7 are about half of that. If you take longer, let each lesson take more than one meeting. If you take less time, extra questions are provided for discussion called "For Further Thought"

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

### **[1N] 1st Peter 1:10-11** This is how I see it:

- "of the grace that would come to you" God's unearned and undeserved favor given to Peter's readers (i.e. you and I)

- "Spirit of Christ within them was indicating" the Holy Spirit inspiring them

- "the glories to follow" the resurrection, ascension and return of Jesus Christ our Lord and King.

**1 Peter Chapter 2**: We are to seek to be holy and to grow in Christian maturity. Starting with Jesus, God is creating a new kind of thing, a church. We are the building blocks He is using. We are exhorted to maintain holiness. We are to submit to the rightful authority of others over us. We are to love others. Again he mentions that we are to expect suffering in this life. [20] 1st Peter 2:21-24 In my opinion this passage in First Peter is an allusion to Isaiah chapter 53 which describes how the coming Messiah will suffer. (Verse 22 is even a quote from Is 53:9). Jesus did nothing wrong and yet He was called to suffer for our sake. How can we, who have done much wrong, complain about being called on to suffer from time to time? Sometimes we need to show our joy in the midst of suffering so that some poor lost soul can see the power of Jesus Christ and begin to understand the Gospel. Do you suffer or have you suffered for the cause of Christ?

[3L] 1st Peter 3:1-2 For me a key phrase is the first few words of verse 1, "In the same way,..." (or in KJV "likewise") Clearly the reader is expected to look at the context of what went right before this verse. I think the context meant by Peter starts with 1 Peter 2:21, "For you have been called for this purpose..." We are all supposed to follow Christ's example, not just wives. We are supposed to be noticeably different in the way we act, so that people will be attracted, not to us, but to Jesus Christ. As Francis of Assisi said, "Preach the gospel at all times. Use words if necessary." Do you do this? Why or why not?

- (3m) Aren't the ideas in 1st Peter 3:1-6 old fashioned and completely out of step with modern understanding? A marriage like that would not work today, would it?
- (3n) Compare 1 Peter 3:8-12 with Psalm 34:12-16. What did you learn?



### [5K] 1st Peter 5:1-4 This is how I see it:

- "Shepherd the flock of God among you," The pastor tends to the spiritual needs of the congregation.
- "exercising oversight not under compulsion, but voluntarily," He does not give orders and commands, but takes the time to convince others to do what is best.
- "according to the will of God; and not for sordid gain," He bases his decisions on what is
  best for God's kingdom, not what is best for himself, or even his church. His vision is
  always on the work of God in the whole world, not just his little corner of it.
- "but with eagerness;" He shows a positive attitude at all times.
- "nor yet as lording it over those allotted to your charge," He never thinks of himself as better than those who he leads or helps.
- "but proving to be examples to the flock." He practices what he preaches.

- (5L) Peter's sermon in Acts 2 is about what Jesus Christ has accomplished for us. This letter from Peter has that same theme, but spends a lot of time talking about the real consequences in our lives as a result of becoming believers in Christ. You could say that Acts 2 is evangelical and 1st Peter is about discipleship, or that Acts 2 is theological and 1st Peter is practical. (Acts 2:23-24, 32 with 1 Peter 1:20-21 and Acts 2:41 with 1 Peter 3:20 are the most striking.) Compare Acts 2 with 1st Peter and see if you agree with me. Do you? Why or why not?
