Part 3: Nominative and Accusative Quiz

This part of the quiz shows how the article can be used to determine the case and number of a noun. It uses Greek articles with English nouns to demonstrate how you can use the article to aid in translation. In order to keep it simple only the nominative and accusative is used. Each sentence of this part of the quiz consists of a subject, verb, and direct object. For each sentence you are shown two noun phrases and the verb. Using the Greek article you can determine whether the noun phrase is nominative case making it the subject or accusative case making it the direct object.

gives the English noun's case and number. The first one is completed as an example.
