The writer of Hebrews is exhorting and encouraging us to live with confidence and trust in our Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ, the High Priest of the New Covenant of Grace. The point he is making is that if we trust Him, really trust Him, we will do as He says, we will obey Him. He goes on to say in Hebrews 4:14-16 that our success in keeping our hearts soft, our obedience immediate, and entering into His final rest, is not dependent on us, but on Him, Who is faithful and able.
