
Lesson 3 – Lost and Found (Luke 15:1-10)

Jesus observes competition for the best seats, teaches on humility, being ready for the kingdom, the cost of discipleship, and the joy in heaven when sinners repent.

Suggested methodology for each lesson:

- 1. Fellowship (Save most of this for the end of class.)
- 2. Take prayer requests (Try to keep it from becoming a competition to see who has the most or the worst.)
- 3. Pray (The idea here is to leave our troubles with God so we can give His word our attention with a clear mind.)
- 4. Read the lesson's text aloud from the Bible. (... or a few verses at a time as you answer the questions.)
- 5. Answer and *briefly* discuss the "fill in the blank" questions. (Let those who prefer to listen, listen. My answers on the next page are just one opinion; you may have a better answer if it is based on Scripture.)
- 6. On the final "Think & Pray" question everyone should take a few minutes to pray over it and jot down their own thoughts before the discussion. **This will give the Holy Spirit a time to speak.**
- 7. Discuss your "Think & Pray" answers. (Never force anyone to share theirs. As with the other questions, my answer is just one more opinion; you may have a better answer.)
- 8. Close in prayer (It is best to call on others to pray, but try to get their permission ahead of time.)
- 9. Fellowship (Leave this as open ended as possible for the time and place you meet.)

Depending on the number of people, each lesson is expected to take about one hour. Steps 4 thru 7 are about half of that. If you take longer, let each lesson take more than one meeting, or consider breaking into two groups. If you take less time, extra questions are provided for discussion called "For Further Thought"

- [1A] Luke 14:7 What observation preceded Jesus' speaking? Seeing how they picked seats
- [1B] Luke 14:8-9 Which seat did Jesus say should be avoided? Place of honor
- [1C] Luke 14:10 Which seat did Jesus say should be chosen? Last place
- [1D] Luke 14:11 Who will be exalted? He who humbles himself
- [1E] Luke 14:12-14 When will acts of kindness be repaid? At the resurrection of the righteous
- [1F] Luke 14:15 Who did His audience say would be blessed?

Those who will eat bread in the kingdom of God.

- [1G] Luke 14:16-17 A man giving a big dinner did what when it was ready? Notified the guests to come
- [1H] Luke 14:19-20 What kind of excuses did the host receive from the guests? <u>I'm looking at some property</u>, <u>I'm trying out some oxen</u>, <u>and I am recently married</u>. In case you don't know much about their culture, these are poor excuses.
- [11] Luke 14:21 Where did the host send to find guests? The city for the poor, crippled and blind
- [1J] Luke 14:22-23 Where did the host send to find more guests? The highways and hedgerows
- [1K] Luke 14:24 Who had become unwelcome at the feast? Those invited who had the poor excuses.
- [1L] I saw a lady ask a visitor in our worship service to move because he had sat in her normal spot. He never came back. As a matter of fact, that was in a church I *used* to go to. Have you ever been involved in either end of such an interaction? Explain.

- (1k) What does the Parable in Luke 14:15-24 mean? How can we apply that to our everyday life?
- (1L) Compare Luke 14:15-24 with Matthew 22:2-14. What is the same? What is different?
- (1m) How often do you invite Christians to your house for fellowship?
- (1n) Do you ever intentionally humble yourself? How or why not?
- (10) Do you ever perform "random acts of kindness?" What or why not?



- [2B] Luke 14:26 What did Jesus say was required to be His disciple? Hating your family members
- [2C] Luke 14:27 What did Jesus say was required to be His disciple? Carrying your cross to your death
- [2D] Luke 14:28 What do people do before erecting a building? Calculate the cost
- [2E] Luke 14:29-30 What might happen if you don't calculate the cost? Failure and ridicule
- [2F] Luke 14:31 What does a military leader do before a battle? Consider if he can win or not
- [2G] Luke 14:32 What does the leader do if he thinks he cannot win? Ask for peace terms
- [2H] Luke 14:33 What did Jesus say was required to be His disciple? Give up your possessions
- [2I] Luke 14:34-35 What happens to useless salt? It is thrown out It can't even be used as fertilizer

- [3B] Luke 15:2 Who objected to Jesus' audience? Pharisees and scribes
- [3C] Luke 15:3-4 What makes a man leave his flock and go searching? One lost sheep
- [3D] Luke 15:5 What did the man do when he found the lost sheep? Carried it rejoicing
- [3E] Luke 15:6 What did the man do when he returned home? He celebrated finding the lost sheep
- [3F] Luke 15:7 When someone repents of his sin, where is there a celebration? In Heaven
- [3G] Luke 15:8 What do people search for when it is lost? Money The coin was about a day's wages
- [3H] Luke 15:9 What did the lady do when she found her lost money? Celebrated
